Butterflies, ladybugs, spiders, worms...the outdoors is full of wonderful little critters. They are fun to follow and watch. But remember to let wildlife live free.

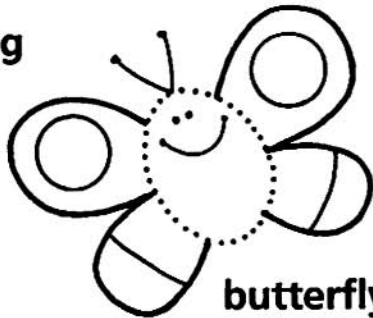
Wild animals have work to do in nature. Ladybugs and spiders eat insects that could destroy crops. Butterflies spread pollen, which

helps flowers grow. Worms turn the soil, keeping plants healthy.

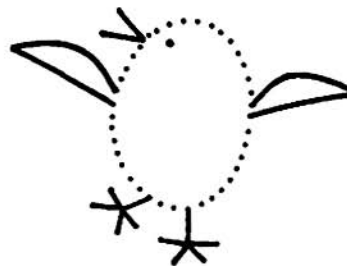

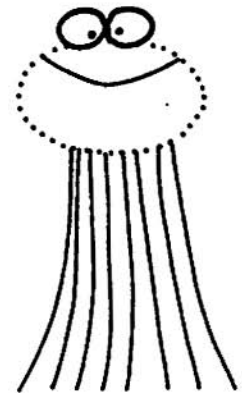

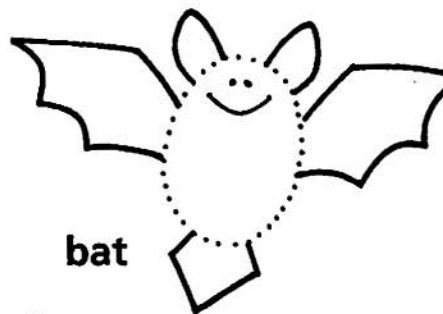

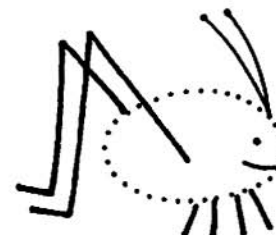
